- Entry Fee:** \$180 if received 2 weeks before your tournament (see above). \$200 if received 10 days before your tournament. Membership fees are NOT included in the entry fee. Any checks returned NSF will be charged a \$35.00 fee. No entry fees refunded after the deadline date. Make checks payable to: Yakima Valley Sports Authority (YVSA). A service fee of \$8 will be added to any VISA/MasterCard payment. **All teams are guaranteed 4 games.**
- AAU Membership:** All players and coaches must have a 2010 AAU Card. Costs are: **Player \$12.00 Coach: \$14.00. NOTE:** Anyone that coaches the team from the bench must also have an AAU card. AAU cards are valid through August 31, 2010. **REMEMBER:** Membership cards don't get you into the game for free. Only players that are playing are allowed into the game free. **Memberships must be purchased online:** [www.aausports.org](http://www.aausports.org).
- The Lystedt Law:** Washington State has passed a law requiring youth coaches, athletes and parents/guardians complete certain criteria regarding the recognition and treatment of head injuries during sporting events. All participating teams must complete the attached form and return it to the YVSA office with the entry form.
- Tournament Rules:**
1. The roster established at the time of the first game must be used throughout the entire tournament. No additions or changes are permitted.
  2. A player may play on more than one team AS LONG AS BOTH TEAMS ARE PART OF THE SAME AAU CLUB! For example, if there are 2 teams from the Boise Hoop Dreams AAU Club, an athlete may play on 2 Boise Hoop Dreams teams during this event.
  3. Girls cannot play on boys teams and boys cannot play on girls teams.
  4. Scorekeepers – each team is to have ONE person to keep the individual score sheet that is provided in your coach's packet. One scorekeeper per team will be allowed into the game free of charge. Please leave scoresheets with the gym supervisor after your game.
  5. Coaches – Only ONE coach per team is allowed into the game free, but more than one may coach.
  6. Admission fees – The gyms are run by clubs, proceeds from admissions go back into their clubs for local youth activities. Friday: \$3 Adult, \$2 Student. Saturday: \$4 Adult, \$3 Student. Sunday: \$4 Adult, \$3 Student. PLEASE INFORM YOUR PARENTS!

**Roster:**

The roster established at the time of the first game must be used throughout the entire tournament. Players must have cards purchased in advance to participate.

Inland Empire players must come from Eastern Washington and Idaho.

\*Boy's and Girl's teams are allowed to pick up a total of three (3) players from Oregon, Utah, Alaska, Pacific, Pacific Northwest, Wyoming and Montana Districts. There are rules that you must follow in order to pick up these players. All of this must be done before the deadline.

**Rules of play:**

2009-2010 High School Federation Rules, with the following exceptions:

1. No shot clock
2. 8U thru 12U boys and all girls divisions will use the women's size basketball (28.5").
3. Quarters (BOYS): 8U – 10U: 6 min / 11U-14U: 7 min / All other divisions: 8 min
4. Quarters (GIRLS): 8U – 9U: 6 min / 10U-13U: 7 min / All other divisions: 8 min
5. Overtime: 2 minutes each
6. Technical or Intentional Fouls – 2 points awarded and the ball out of bounds.
  - a. One technical foul on a coach or fan and he/she is ejected from the gym. One technical on a player and the player must sit on the bench for the remainder of the game. Officials and gym administrators have the right to eject a fan, player or coach. Coaches and fans must leave the gym completely.

**Boys National AAU Rules:**

Limit the roster to 15 players. See the boys basketball rules at [www.aauboysbasketball.org](http://www.aauboysbasketball.org). The coach is responsible for all rules set down for tournament play. Eligibility to participate is based first on the age determining date. An athlete who does not meet the age determining date may qualify under the grade exception rule. In the 8U/2nd Grade thru the 14U/8th Grade division, each team is allowed a maximum of three (3) grade exception athletes. There is no limit on the number of grade exception athletes in the 15U/9th Grade divisions thru the Senior Boy's division.

**Boys Age Determining Date:**

September 1, 2010 shall be the determining date for the age of the competitor and shall hold true from District through the National Championship.

8 and Under / 2nd Grade

Born on or after September 1, 2001. Exception: A player who is in the 2nd Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 2000 can participate in the 8-Under/2nd Grade Division.

9 and Under / 3rd Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 2000. Exception: A player who is in the 3rd Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1999 can participate in the 9-Under/3rd Grade Division.

10 and Under / 4th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1999. Exception: A player who is in the 4th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1998 can participate in the 10-Under/4th Grade Division.

11 and Under / 5th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1998. Exception: A player who is in the 5th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1997 can participate in the 11-Under/5th Grade Division.

12 and Under / 6th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1997. Exception: A player who is in the 6th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1996 can participate in the 12-Under/6th Grade Division.

13 and Under / 7th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1996. Exception: A player who is in the 7th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1995 can participate in the 13-Under/7th Grade Division.

14 and Under / 8th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1995. Exception: A player who is in the 8th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1994 can participate in the 14-Under/8th Grade Division.

15 and Under / 9th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1994. Exception: A player who is in the 9th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1993 can participate in the 15-Under/9th Grade Division.

16 and Under / 10th Grade:

Born on or after September 1, 1993. Exception: A player who is in the 10th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1992 can participate in the 16-Under/10th Grade Division.

17 and Under / Juniors:

Born on or after September 1, 1992. Exception: A player who is in the a junior and who was born on or after September 1, 1991 can participate in the 17-Under/Junior Division.

19 and Under / Seniors:

Born on or after September 1, 1990 (no later than summer following High School Class Graduation or Prep School graduation). No limit on the number of grade exception athletes.

## **Girls National AAU Rules:**

Limit the roster to 15 players in Inland Empire Championships. For every player over twelve (12), you will be limited to the number of players that you would be allowed to pick up if you advance to a National Championship. Players must be at the District Championships to participate in the National Finals. Any player under 18 who has attended college or junior college is eligible to play in this championship, except for NCAA Division I or II athletes. College Athletes must have a letter from the Athletic director in order to participate in the District Championships.

All home school students must register with the State Department of Education and belong to an accredited home school organization. The student can get a letter from that organization stating the grade level in which she is currently enrolled. If an athlete has been academically advanced and is a grade level ahead of her age group, she can appeal for a grade exception. A grade exception form, her birth certificate and a letter from her school (on school stationary) stating she has been accelerated must be sent to the Certification Chair for approval.

## CONCUSSION LAW REQUIREMENTS

### Club Compliance Statement

HB1824, otherwise known as the Zachery Lystedt Law, was signed into law on May 14, 2009. It requires, as of July 26, 2009, that additional steps be taken regarding concussions in private non-profit youth athletic programs using school district facilities.

This bill requires training and documentation which AAU Member Clubs must adhere to. AAU players and their parents/guardians must meet these minimum requirements:

1. All AAU member coaches will have to take training on the nature and risk of concussions and head injury including continuing to play after a concussion or head injury.
2. On a yearly basis, a concussion and head injury information sheet shall be signed and returned by the youth athlete and athlete's parents/guardian prior to the youth athlete's initiating practice or competition.
3. All athletes suspected of suffering a concussion or brain injury will be removed from practice or competition and not returned to play until cleared in writing by a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussions (Medical Doctors, Doctor of Osteopathy, Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner, Physicians Assistants, and *Certified* Athletic Trainers).
