9 and Under/3 rd Grade:	Born on or after September 1, 1991. Exception: A player who is in the 3^{rd} Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1990 can participate in the 9-Under/ 3^{rd} Grade Division.
10 and Under/4 th Grade:	Born on or after September 1, 1990. Exception: A player who is in the 4th Grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1989 can participate in the 10-Under/4 th Grade Division.

- b. A player participating in the 16-Under/10th grade division may also compete in either the junior or senior divisions.
- c. A player in the Junior boys division may also compete in the Senior division.
- d. Since games are played on the same weekend, make sure that the players name is on the roster form of teams he wishes to participate with.
- e. Players who compete in more than one division under this rule must compete within the same AAU club.

Girls National AAU Rules:

-Limit the roster to 15 players in Association Championships. For every player over twelve (12), you will be limited to the number of players that you would be allowed to pick up if you advance to a National Championship. Players must be at the Association Championships to participate in the National Finals. Any player under 18 who has attended college or junior college is eligible to play in this championship, except for NCAA Division I or II athletes. College Athletes must have a letter from the Athletic director in order to participate in the Association Championships. Girls MUST be present at the Association Finals to be eligible for national advancement.
